What Are you Waiting for this Christmas?

Paradise Valley United Methodist Church and Christians around the world celebrate the season of Advent beginning **Sunday, November 29**, and ending on **Christmas Day**. The first day, we offer a Family Sunday, when children and youth worship with their families at one of our services in lieu of classes. We'll have another Family Sunday after Christmas on **Sunday, December 27**.

On **Christmas Eve — Wednesday, December 24** — PVUMC will again offer five worship services, with candlelight services at 5, 7, 9 and 11 p.m., and an Ignite-style service at 3 p.m. All services except for the 3 p.m. will be in the sanctuary. Our Family Service is at 5 p.m., and features the Praise Singers children's choir. At 7 and 9 p.m., the youth and adult choirs and handbell groups perform, accompanied by a string quartet, organ and piano music. At 11 p.m., communion will be available following the traditional "Lessons and Carols" worship. Childcare is available at 3, 5 and 7 p.m. Join us as we welcome the Christ child and end our season of "Waiting."

Throughout the month of December, we offer several ways to experience Christmas. On **Sunday, December 6**, at 6 p.m., we invite you to our PVUMC Christmas Concert, "And the Angels Sang," where all of our musical ensembles and choirs perform. On **Friday, December 11**, 6-8 p.m., families with children under 10 are invited to our Christmas Wonderland event, and on **Sunday, December 13**, we experience Christmas through the eyes of a child.

PVUMC Publishes Own Advent Study

PVUMC has written and published its first Advent study guide, *Waiting*. The book has five chapters, written by the clergy, as well as Christopher Wurpts, PVUMC's youth ministries director, and Keith Sobraske, an Adult Learning leader. PVUMC member Cheryl Del Monte did the initial content editing, and Pam R. Selthun, communications director, edited for style, format and consistency.



Each chapter focuses on a different type of waiting, offering brief commentary on passages of scripture, discussion questions to consider, and personal stories from members of our church family. Several small groups are meeting on campus to discuss the book, and we invite you to join one during this season. Check the website for the class offerings, on every day of the week except for Thursday and Saturday.

The paperback book is only available at the church, and costs \$10. More than 125 copies already have been sold. We also offer a digital version for \$6.99 at Amazon.com. Search for "Waiting Advent" or [click here for the direct link](#). Feedback and reviews are welcome!







FROM PARADISE

Dear Friends,

Can you hear the sound of the future? We heard it recently in church one Sunday morning. You might have missed it. It wasn't the easiest sound to hear. Some may have been upset about it. Some might not have recognized it, but the baby in the back who was exercising his vocal chords, let us know he was there. That cry was the sound of the next generation of our church, and that child may become a future leader or pastor.

I love the sound of children and babies in church. It means the church is alive. It means we are a place where young families are comfortable, and want to bring their children. Sadly, this young family was told by someone sitting near them that they should take their child to the nursery. It left them feeling unwelcome. I have found that many parents, when they visit the first few times, are not always comfortable leaving their child in a strange place with a complete stranger they have never met before. I can't blame them for wanting their child with them in church until they have reached a level of trust and comfort with us. If we want young families at PVUMC, every one of us will need to be welcoming. It might mean we lay aside our own comforts in worship to help a young family know we are glad to have them, even if their child makes a little noise.

I hear another sound of the future coming. Our Church and Society Ministry Team is sponsoring an important presentation on inclusiveness and how we understand Christianity and homosexuality. We've been inviting discussion in our adult groups and classes about this issue, and making time to learn and listen to one another.

Being a welcoming church for our LGBT brothers and sisters is sometimes a difficult topic for us. We understand we are called by God to love all who come to us. I support building a more inclusive church that welcomes everyone, including our LGBT members. I also want a church that is open to having conversations about important issues. We never want to be a church that avoids tough issues out of fear of controversy.

What do we know about the future? We know that God will be there. Just as God has been with us in the past and present, we know God will meet us in the days ahead. We face the future guided by our vision of a "love that crosses all barriers and embraces all people."

This vision will build a strong and diverse community of faithful believers who "bring God's love into action." — *Pastor Dave Summers*
