



137 Miles: Journey with Jesus to Easter

This Lent, Paradise Valley United Methodist Church invites you on a journey. Just as Jesus traveled from Mount Hermon to Jerusalem so long ago, we'll journey together at and around PVUMC, reflecting on the parables Jesus told in the Gospel of Luke, and on what this journey meant as he walked closer to his death on the cross, and resurrection from the dead on Easter.

Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday, February 10**, and ends on **Easter Sunday, March 27**. We invite you to attend one of our two Ash Wednesday services: one at 12 noon in the chapel and the other at 6:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. That morning, the pastors will offer ashes to arriving Preschool families.

Holy Week begins on Passion or **Palm Sunday, March 20**. We look forward to the children's Sunday School Palm Parade at 9:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary, marking Jesus' triumphant entry into the holy city of Jerusalem. We also invite you to stop by H1 to experience the interactive stations featuring the parables told in the Gospel of Luke. Go to page 3 to read more about this.

Maundy Thursday worship on **March 24** at 7 p.m. is a journey to the Upper Room and Jesus' Last Supper. On **Good Friday, March 25**, join us for a reflective service of scriptures, music and candlelight at 7 p.m. in the sanctuary. Finally, we invite you to celebrate Easter with us on **Sunday, March 27**. The first service is a 6 a.m. sunrise service in the outdoor amphitheater. The other three are held in our sanctuary, at 8, 9:30 and 11:15 a.m.

PVUMC Publishes Own Lenten Study

PVUMC has written and published its first study guide for Lent, called *137 Miles: A Journey with Jesus*. The book has five chapters, like the previous Advent study

written by the clergy, as well as Christopher Wurpts, PVUMC's youth ministries director, and Keith Sobraske, an adult learning leader. This time, Rev. Brenda Smith, David Lex, Stu Selthun and Tawn Watkins join Keith Sobraske as writers, while PVUMC member Cheryl Del Monte and Pam R. Selthun, communications director, were retained as editors.



Each chapter focuses on the steps we are encouraged to take during Lent, and offers conversation starters, questions to consider, commentary on passages of scripture, takeaways, challenges and meditations. Several small groups are meeting on campus to discuss the book, and we invite you to join one during this season. We'll also offer a few scheduled activities such as hikes and labyrinth walks. 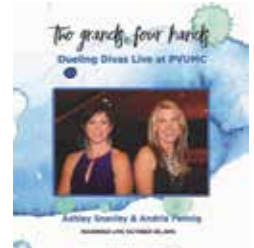

On **December 18, 2015**, Azra Hussain wrote on her Facebook page:

"Today God Blessed the Muslim community in Scottsdale and showed us what love, friendship and good neighbors look like.

Yesterday I was informed by the Scottsdale Police Department that a group who call themselves the Bible Believers will be protesting at the Islamic Center of the Northeast Valley aka Scottsdale Mosque. I let my friends of all faiths know what I had been told. Some friends wrote messages of support and love and regret that due to travel or poor health they could not be with us but would be with us in spirit. Some came to stand with us in prayer at our Jumaa service. Above all of the ugly words that the demonstrators were shouting over the megaphone, your quiet and serene presence and your sincere and deep desire to be present was felt and heard loud and clear.

I want to be a friend like you, I want to be a neighbor like you and I want to be able to show all mankind the love that you all so generously shared with us today."

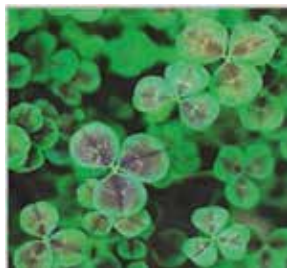

FROM PARADISE

Dear Friends,

The church is often uncomfortable talking about money. We talk from time to time about giving, but rarely do we have conversation about earning money or saving money.

John Wesley had some interesting things to say here about the importance and use of money in our lives. In one sermon, called "The Use of Money," he said that the important thing isn't money itself but how we use it. Wesley's pointed advice still rings true today: "Earn all you can, save all you can, give all you can."

Many of us struggle with earning enough money, learning how to save money, and being able to give as much as we want. As we begin our Giving Campaign this year, we will talk frankly about how you might earn all you can, save all can and give all you can. Wesley wanted to equip faithful people like us to be able to earn, save and give in ways that help us experience the fullness of life in Christ. He wanted us to participate fully in God's purposes for this world and not see our financial life as separate from our spiritual life. The Bible actually has a lot to say about how we earn and save. We'll talk about these timely matters around money so that we can more fully live as God intended.

We'll also be moving into our Lenten season early in February. I invite you to join us for a 137-mile journey with Jesus as he leaves the Mount of Transfiguration (Mt. Hermon) and travels to Jerusalem, his city of destiny. In Luke's gospel, nine chapters are devoted to this travelogue filled with significant encounters and teaching by Jesus. Luke reminds us how Jesus deliberately set his face towards Jerusalem, a commitment that affects both the journey and its culmination at the cross. We join this revealing pilgrimage with Christ. We recognize that our life of faith is always a journey, one that is taking us to God, and one that ultimately moves from earth to heaven. On this 137-mile journey during Lent, we will talk about the parables Jesus shared as he traveled towards Holy Week. Each parable is a journey itself, and describes a distinctive movement of faith (from fear to love or from helplessness to hopefulness). Finally, on Easter Sunday, we will make the most significant move of our Lenten time, as we witness Jesus move from death to life. You can share in this journey with us in a variety of important ways that will help you to move closer to God. Come travel with us and Jesus in this meaningful time.
